



Literacy & Numeracy Funding Report 2019-2020

Additional funding is allocated to schools to support year 7 students who did not meet the expected standard (100) in reading and / or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.

Felpham Community College use the funding to pay for:

- Additional staff in maths, English and SEN to enable smaller group, specialist teaching
- Early morning reading recovery programme
- Individual tuition and support as required in English & maths
- Accelerated reading programme
- Focused intervention from online diagnostic testing

Student numbers 2017-2018: Literacy 77 Maths 76

Allocated funding: £ 22,123

Measuring Impact

53/77, 69% of student are on or above their aspirational target level in English
30/76, 39%, of students are on or above their aspirational target level in Maths

Student Numbers 2018-2019: Literacy 47 Maths 40

Allocated funding: £23,064

Measuring Impact

38/47, 80% of students are on or above their aspirational target in English
24/39, 61% of students are on or above their aspirational target in Maths

Student Numbers 2019-2020: Literacy 66 Maths 59

Allocated funding: £19,581
