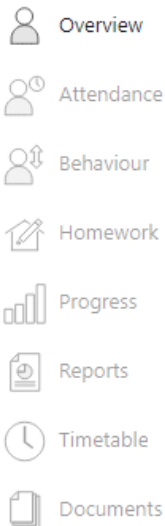
Year 7 Parents / Carers - Logging onto Go4schools for the first time

3. LFD Testing

I wanted to pass on my thanks to all parents, carers and students for supporting our mass testing once again at the start of term. The students behaved admirably, were very sensible and calm throughout. Well done to them - and of course well done to our fantastic testing team who have yet again stepped up and over their time to keep everyone safe. Please continue to test twice a week using your at-home LFD test kits. We will be giving out the new kits next week during tutor time. We will continue to do this until government guidance changes. The best times to test are Sunday and Wednesday evenings.

Please be aware that government guidance is now that any adults double vaccinated and/or anyone 18 years and under does not need to self-isolate, even if they are a close contact of a positive case. The only time a child would need to self-isolate is if they themselves tested positive on a PCR test. These are only necessary if the individual has Covid symptoms. If your child does show symptoms please do not send them into school, instead organise a PCR and email our let our Attendance Officer Mrs Crook know if it is positive - attendance@felpham.org.uk. If the PCR is negative your child should return to school as soon as possible.

4. **Absence Reporting - message for Parents and Carers**

Please note all absences should be reported to the attendance officer not form tutors or year offices, thank you. Absences include: holidays, medical / dental appointments, illnesses and late arrivals.

Absences can be reported in the following ways:

Please follow the below procedures when reporting your child's absence:

- Please report all absences before 8.30am where possible.
- Please try to arrange all appointments outside of school time; where this is not possible, advance warning should be given and children should attend school before and/or after the appointment (unless otherwise agreed).
- When reporting your child's illness, please give a very brief overview of the illness.
 - For example: Cold, sickness, headache etc (rather than 'unwell' or 'under the weather'). This category will enable us to record the absence correctly and to ensure that we can offer support for the illness if needed, or be able to protect the other children in school if necessary.
 - Full details of illnesses / issues can be given to the Year Managers or Year Leaders (as well as reporting the overview to the attendance office).

Thank you for doing your best to get your children into school and we hope that in the event where absence cannot be avoided, this simplifies things a little.

6. **School uniform**

School uniform is a key feature of a successful school, if students look smart it creates a work-like atmosphere in school and leads to fewer distractions from learning. Please note the following reminders:

- From this term, hoodies and branded sweatshirts are not permitted around school.
- The school tie needs to be worn at a length that you can see (at least) seven stripes on it; they should not be worn shorter than this.

7. **Important Medical Information (reminder)**

If your child requires prescription medication within school hours, it is imperative that this is brought into school for it to be stored in the medical room.

The medication below requires to be in duplicate - one to be kept on your child through the school day and the second to be kept in the medical room for emergency backup:

- Blue inhaler
- Auto-injector and antihistamine for treatment of life-threatening allergies (not hay fever)
- Supplies for management of diabetes (no paperwork required just supplies)

Please note:

1. The medication should be in the original prescription packaging along with any instruction leaflets.
2. Antibiotics can only be administered if required four times a day.

Year 11 - Careers interviews and Mock Interview Day

Mock interview day will take place on Friday 5th November, hopefully in a face-to-face format. If you are one of those that has not yet completed and sent a CV to me, please do so as soon as possible, as these need to be sent out to potential interviewers for them to look through beforehand.
