#### 12. Wonder goal ends the cup journey for Year 7 Girls

It is with great pride that I write this report; Year 7 girls travelled to Millais school in Horsham to take part in the quarter-final of the county cup on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> February. Millais is a big, all girls school with 300 students in each year group, so the FCC girls knew they were going to be in for a tight, challenging fixture, and it did not disappoint.

The game started very evenly, with both teams having chances at both ends. The defence of Isabelle, Juliet and Millie was solid throughout, and they came under pressure from all angles, with some fantastic wing-play from the Millais girls but it was soon dealt with quickly. Every tackle made was swept up by Grace in midfield, who often found Izzy or Hattie on the wings to take it down the pitch, and that is how the first goal came. A great attacking run by Hattie saw a ball fizz across the area for Chloe to attack. As she did so, she banged into the keeper and defender, who were trying to clear the ball, for it to fall to Neve to pass into an empty net. Felpham were 1-0 up and the girls had a spring in their step.

Unfortunately, this was not long lived when a good tackle by Grace saw the ball deflect up to her arm just past the half way line. The resulting free-kick saw Millais best player strike the ball really well, and it kept high-drifting into the top of the net, a goal Paris would need to be 2 foot taller to save. This knocked the wind out of Felpham's sails and shortly after this, Millais strikers easily unpicked the disgruntled midfield and defence of Felpham to score a scrappy goal in the bottom corner. It was only the brilliance of Paris in goal, diving low to knock a shot past the post, that kept the score 2-1 at half time.

On came the changes of Willow, India, Holli, Daisy and Sophia making an instant impact and coming close a couple of times, only for the very competent and huge-kicking Millais goalkeeper to clear up the danger. Her huge kicks were intercepted by Isabelle, Grace or Juliet taking it in turns to pick themselves up - after being hit with it - and breaking through for Willow or Holli to attack again. The pressure was now on and Felpham started to create more chances. On came Neve and Izzy who, after resting their legs, had an instant impact with Grace passing to Izzy - who slotted it through to Neve to just shoot wide. It was only a matter of time before Felpham scored an equaliser and it came with about 10 minutes to go when Hattie tackled well, passed it to Grace who shot from outside the area in to the top corner.

Again, Millais came back for the last 10 minutes - securing corner after corner and with 1 minute to go, their talented striker weaved past the defenders to be one-on-one with Paris. Well, we all know how good Paris is in these circumstances, having already saved 2 penalties in other games, and she never disappointed. She flew out of her goal at the attacker's feet to save the goal -, a fantastic save. With the score at 2-2 on the final whistle, 10 minutes of extra time began. Millais had many players who could strike the ball really well and that was obviously their tactic in extra time. Sophia, India, Millie and nearly every other player were constantly working hard to put themselves in front of the shots and this was tiring them out. It was very even throughout extra time. but it was with 2 minutes to go that a shot came in from out just inside Felpham's half, Paris saved this and it went out for a corner. From the corner, Millais worked the ball out to the edge of the box with Felpham players all around and, out of nowhere, a shot was released from Millais striker and nearly broke the top corner of the net; A goal worthy of winning any game.

Millais came away as 3 - 2 winners but it was a resilient and passionate performance that all the Felpham girls can be proud of; next up is the district league after half-term.

As National Apprenticeship Week 2022 draws to a close, I am sharing again with you the information that was in last week's bulletin as I know, from some of the conversations I have had with students this week, that they didn't look at the presentation! In a nutshell:

- An apprenticeship is a real job
- Apprentices are paid a salary
- Apprenticeships last a minimum of 12 months
- Apprenticeships range from level 2 to level 7
- · Apprentices do not pay for their training
- There are thousands of apprenticeships in more than 170 industries

#### Students in Years 10 and above

**Virtual work experience in medicine, dentistry and veterinary** Medic Mentor has now relaunched their programme as a free resource you can access any time of day as E-learning. This is a fantastic free resource for you to help you make an informed decision about a career in Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary.

Once you complete all sessions you will receive a certificate which can be used as part of your application to Medical, Dental or Veterinary School. Click on the relevant hyperlink below to access the programme you are interested in.

<u>Medicine</u> - Throughout February you will explore Intensive Care - Intensive Care units (ICU) look after the most critically unwell patients in the hospital and so it is usually incredibly challenging to see what happens inside. See behind-the-scenes of intensive care with high fidelity simulations, and learn the unique workings of the MDT (Multi-disciplinary Team) in ICU.

<u>Veterinary</u> - February's session explores lambing and sheep husbandry. Lambing is most students' favourite placement and Medic mentor are really excited to be streaming it to students. Although a lot of joy comes with lambing, it is also a key placement where resilience is required to deal with the loss of lambs.

<u>Dental</u> - February introduces you to the team at Dental Mentor Smiles where you will get to see a range of both child and adult patient consultations. This includes a possible oral cancer diagnosis, aesthetic solutions and child safeguarding concerns. There will be debriefing sessions of each of the cases and opportunities to ask questions directly to the dental team!

**Get a taste of medical school and learn about the impact of Alzheimer's Disease on memory** Queen Mary's University London now have a campus in Malta from where they are hosting a 30 minute lecture about the brain and Alzheimer's, delivered by Dr Keely Kulesza-Smith. #### Year 10 students and Parents / Carers - Futures Week - 4th to 7th July

It is 10 years since we last offered traditional work experience in Key Stage 4 so it is exciting to be bringing back a 21<sup>st</sup> Century version of it this year. Between the 14<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> February each tutor group will be allocated one tutor time to be in a computer room, where either Mrs Nash or Mrs Woodman will assist them in accessing Xello, the computer program that is being used in school to support students in planning their futures.

Students were introduced to this program before Christmas, by their tutors, but only a handful of students have so far accessed the program. By the time we come back to school after half term I will need all students to have accessed the program, completed Matchmaker and to have saved at least 3 careers that they are interested in.
