7. Year 7 Girls' Football

As the season enters its final half-term the Year 7 girls enter into the final league of the year in Hampshire, made up of Year 7 and 8 students. Up in the first week were Horndean Technology College and The Petersfield School. The first fixture of the evening was against Horndean, a team FCC lost to early in the season. As part of each schools development, the games are played at either 7,9 or 11 aside depending on players and ability; what was nice about the first game was that we were able to play 11 vs 11, which is a first for the Felpham girls.

After a rocky start understanding positions, Felpham were soon relaxed and were playing some nice football on the bigger pitch. Daisy, Juliet, Isabelle and Paris were strong and calm at the back, making big challenges and playing the ball through to the returning Evie and Hattie in midfield. When the Horndean players did find time and space to shoot, it was Sophia in goal who kept them out. It was late in the first half when Felpham finally got their chance, with a good ball through from Willow, Grace was able to take the ball around the goal-keeper and slot it in the bottom corner - 1-0 to Felpham at half-time.

The second half started well for Horndean and it wasn't long before they had pulled a goal back to make it 1-1. Shortly after that, a mix up in midfield followed by a fantastic ball through the middle allowed the Horndean striker to go through on goal to make it 2-1 to Horndean. Felpham were quite deflated at this point because they were the better team, and it was in the last few minutes when Holli and Chloe worked the ball through to Grace to slot the ball into the bottom corner on the second attempt. The game finished 2-2 with both teams happy with their performances.

The Petersfield School were in the wings waiting for the next game. They were very similar in set up to Horndean and the game was again able to played 11 v 11, which was fantastic. It was very slow in starting, with chances at both ends with Chloe, Willow, Holli and Evie coming close for Felpham. The defence of Isabelle, Juliet, Daisy, Paris and Sophia worked well together to keep Petersfield away from taking any shots, which meant most of the game was played in midfield with Hattie, Evie and Grace; however, it was a game that had 'draw' written all over it from the start and that is how it finished - 0-0.

Well done Year 7 girls, a really good start to this league. Next up on Monday are fixtures against Crookhorn and The Petersfield School second team.
