### Year 10 students- CV writing

After half-term you will be having a couple of lessons in a computer room to put together your CV, in preparation for your Mock Interview Day in the Autumn term of Year 11. You will be using Xello to complete this. Before Christmas I set you all an assignment in Xello that would help when doing your CV. Despite extending the deadline to after Easter, only 3 students have attempted the assignment (but not completed it)! If you would like to get ahead of the game in readiness for the forthcoming lessons, please log into Xello over half term (log into office 365 and then click on the Xello link in Apps) and take a look at the assignment. Ideally you will have completed Skills Lab and uploaded entries into the Experiences and Storyboard sections at the bottom of the About Me page.

### Year 10 -12 students - NHS Allied Healthcare Programme - Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June

This virtual work experience day will take place through an online portal and run **live** from 10am-5pm, following 2 patients from their initial accidents through to recovery. You will be able to interact with a variety of healthcare professionals (listed below) so that you develop an understanding of the multidisciplinary team as well as insights into your own area of interest. You will also have the opportunity to interact with the healthcare professionals via a **live** Chat function and polls throughout the day.

The day will cover the following healthcare careers: nursing, midwifery, paramedicine, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, dietetics, radiography, prosthetics & orthotics, speech & language therapy and pharmacy.

The cost to attend is £10/student per session (or £45 if you book all five sessions). All students who take part in the day will be awarded a certificate to recognise their achievement.

### Year 11 students - Wates 'Build Yourself' Summer Camp - July 17<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> - Free!!

If you are interested in a career in construction then you might want to consider this summer camp. The purpose of the camp is to inspire young people through a fun, unforgettable and inspirational summer experience and to help young people consider the built environment as a possible career sector.

The camp includes:

- 4 nights paid accommodation at De Montfort University, Leicester
- All meals and transport
- Employability sessions
- Group projects

### Parents/Carers of students in Years 7-11 - Locker problems and replacement keys

If your child has an issue with their locker they should first head to the Careers Office (opposite the IT office) and speak to Mrs Nash or Mrs Woodman. If there is no one in the Careers Office they should speak to their year office. If your child loses their locker key you will need to pay £5 for a replacement key via the ParentPay shop. Please be aware that the school does not always have replacement keys in stock; if a replacement key has to be ordered it can take a significant amount of time to replace.
