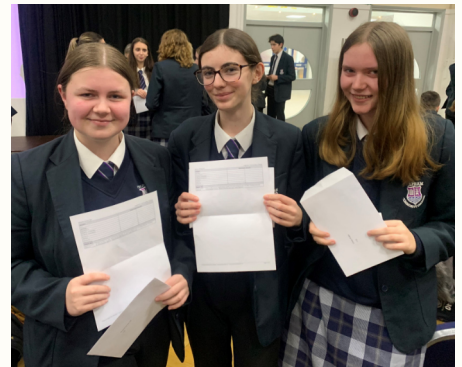
Year 11 Mock Success

His pivotal role in the Worthless campaign saw him on televisions nationwide, campaigning for fairer funding for our students, and striving to make a lasting difference.

As Mark prepares to travel and to spend more time with his wife and their grown-up children, we find ourselves firmly placed on the journey to become the outstanding school of choice within the local area. The Making of Harry Potter

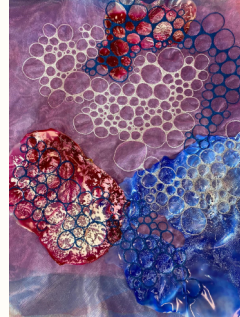
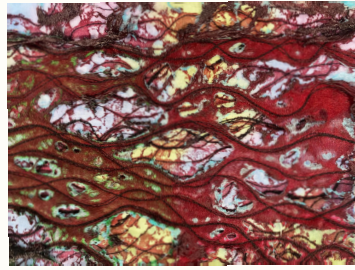
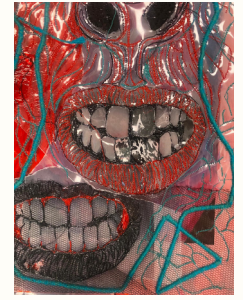
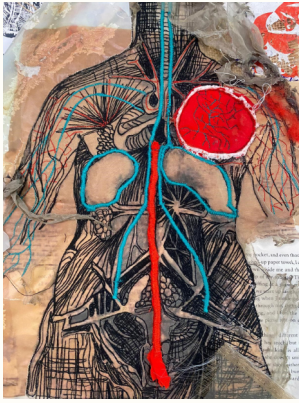

Attendance plays a big part in your child's education and future.

Free School Meals Check if you are entitled

All schools receive additional funding from the government based on the number of students who are entitled and have claimed free school meals. Just registering your child for free school meals means that the school gets this extra money!

Students who are registered receive a daily allowance, currently £2.45, which enables them to purchase a healthy two-course hot lunch or other food. It also entitles them to free milk. Furthermore, our cashless catering system does not differentiate between a student who pays for their meals and a student on free school meals. They will also receive supermarket vouchers for the school holidays.

Please can we remind parents / carers of the importance of using the Arun Leisure Centre car park at drop off and pick up times, for the safety of our students and the general public using the leisure centre. Safer Internet Day February 2023

At Felpham Community College we believe that the safety of students is paramount. In a world of emerging technologies, the online environments that students use every day can be extremely beneficial, as long as students are empowered with the knowledge of how to stay safe.

As a school, we provide students with the opportunity to undertake training in using computers safely and effectively. In year 7 we build on the safety method that primary schools use - the "clever never goes" strategy (see link below for more information).

Students then develop their social networking knowledge in year eight, looking at profile safety and settings. In year 9 students develop an understanding of cyber crime to learn about Phishing scams, email fraud and identity theft. Our Citizenship lessons also provide opportunities to inform students of the dangers they may face and how to make safe choices whilst online.

Recently, we celebrated international Safer Internet Day. We looked at a range of topics during tutor time and raised awareness of online safety to ensure that all our students have the information they need to be informed internet users. The link below to the NSPCC provides useful information for parents regarding chat apps.

We ask students to keep their phones in their bags when they are at school, unless a teacher requests they use them for research, to prevent distractions and to encourage face to face interaction. As a reminder, social media age restrictions are age 13 for Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat.

Congratulations to Miss B Jarvis from our English teaching team, who has been appointed as our new Online Safety Coordinator. She will be working alongside our Designated Safeguard Leads to identify needs, design interventions and implement them in relation to online safety for students and staff.

I even made a marble run which included developing great problem solving skills! I would definitely recommend this trip to other students if they get invited as it was something completely different to a usual school week. Thank you to the teachers who took us as they were good fun and really encouraged us."



A Timeline of the term from the Careers Department

January 17th - A group of year 10 and 11 students tuned into a live assembly with the Army about life at AFC Harrogate, the Army Foundation College. Students heard directly from AFC student alumni, junior soldiers, and instructors about life at AFC Harrogate, how to build character, core skills and develop self-confidence. Students could ask questions via a chat box.

January 30th - Sustainability Challenge – The year 7 and 8 students who took part last term in the first round of the challenge with Albion in the Community, returned to the AMEX to present their ideas to a panel of judges, which included former Dragon’s Den star Sarah Willingham. After volunteers from American Express had helped the groups finalise their presentations Sarah gave an inspirational talk about her journey from school to where she is now. The group then presented their ideas to the panel. Students had been asked to come up with an idea that would improve sustainability either for Brighton and Hove Albion FC or for the school. We had to wait a few weeks to find out the results but are really excited that one of our teams won this round of the challenge with the idea of not producing printed programmes for football matches but rather having an e-programme – saving paper as well as printing and recycling costs. These students had a workshop in school on the 28th February to expand and refine their presentation and will either return to the AMEX or will go to another Premier League football club for the finals. 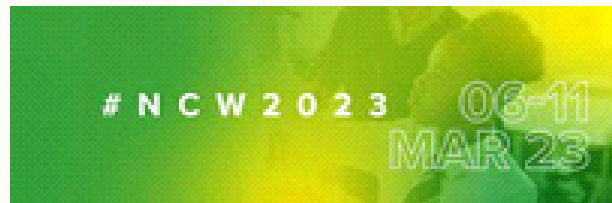
March 6th - 11th National Careers Week – During the week all staff were asked to make careers a focus for their lessons and to highlight to students the careers that their subject might lead to, and how the skills that their subjects teach them are transferable into the workplace.

March 8th – Chichester University School of Nursing and Allied Health visit – A small group of year 12 students travelled to the University to hear about the courses they offer and to experience the state-of-the-art facilities available to potential nurses and physiotherapists.

March 14th – College talk – As part of our sixth form Taster Day, we invited Chichester College to come in and talk to year 11s who have decided to leave FCC and go to the college. Sophie Sargent, School and Community Liaison Officer at the college, talked through the support systems in place for students, the facilities at the college, and other aspects that students will find different from school.

March 30th – Workplace visits for Year 10 – These kicked off with a visit to GTR in Fontwell, who make carbon fibre components mainly for F1 teams, and to Barfoots, our business partner, who are a global farming company. During the 2-hour long visits students were introduced to what the companies do, had a tour of the site and were then introduced to the range of roles the companies employ, and what students need to do if they want to work in that industry.
