Links to Y8 and Y9	-Introduces students to the subject of RPE and the skills they will need to use throughout; group work, discussion, explanation and evaluation.  -Students have the chance to explore different beliefs and begin to learn how to compare and contrast these, as well as exploring their own beliefs.  -Begin to introduce students to the connections between belief and behaviour which will benefit them throughout KS3 studies of religion.	-This unit introduces students to the religions that act as the background to many of the major religions they will go on to study.  -It will introduce students to new key terms and ideas that they will explore throughout KS3 and provides a solid background to the study of religion.	-Introduces key concepts, such as creation, that are present in all religions and ideas that will be explored throughout KS3.  -This unit aims to equip students with knowledge and skills that will act as a foundation for their future studies.	-Christianity is studied throughout KS3 RPE (as required by Locally Agreed Syllabus). This unit will build on studies of Christianity from primary school and give them a foundation of knowledge that will help them as they come back to Christianity throughout KS3.  -This unit will also pick up on ideas and concepts from the units studied so far and begin to develop them.	-This unit will introduce two important concepts that have not been explored to this point; remembrance and celebration in religion.  -Students will explore key festivals and rites of passage.  -Students will use some of the ideas from other units and skills that they have developed in studying religion, particularly from the Spring 2 unit.	-This unit aims to introduce students to skills of oracy, debate and discussion.  -Students learn to think about more challenging concepts through discussion of ultimate questions.  -In later units at KS3 students will engage in a more in-depth study of these key questions so this unit works well as a good basis for those studies.
