## Year 11 - CVs and Mock Interview Day - Friday 10th November

With Mock Interview Day now just four weeks away these are the latest figures regarding the number of CVs we have received - 69 completed and emailed to Mrs Nash (<a href="mailto:lnash1@felpham.org.uk">lnash1@felpham.org.uk</a>) or me (<a href="mailto:gwoodman@felpham.org.uk">gwoodman@felpham.org.uk</a>) and 64 started/completed in Xello but not yet emailed to one of us.

Whilst this is an improvement on last week's situation it still means that 141 students have still not even started their CV, even though two classes had an extra lesson in a computer room this week to do just that.

This <u>step-by-step guide</u> on how to create your CV using Xello will take you through the process. For most of you your CV will be a skill-based one and should not take you more than an hour at most to complete. <u>This sheet</u> should help you link the things you do in your own time with the skills you are developing by doing them. If you have worked through Xello in previous years, completing the in-built lessons, you will find that some of the sections of your CV already have entries in them, based on what you have already recorded in the program.

The deadline has been extended to Wednesday 1st November. There are four netbooks and a computer in the Careers Hub (S13b) that you are welcome to use at lunchtime or after school if you need support in completing your CV, with Mrs Nash and/or I available to support you. You can update your CV as many times as you want to before that deadline. If you send in an updated CV, we will make sure that the latest version is the one that will go to your interviewer on Mock Interview Day.

Not completing a CV **does not** mean that you will not be part of Mock Interview Day, however **it will** affect the feedback you will get for your performance on the day. Next week I will share with you a blank copy of the feedback form that will be completed for each student on the day so that you can see what questions you will be asked and start preparing your answers.

#### Students in Years 8-11 - Keeping Xello up to date

Remember to keep Xello updated with everything you do in and out of school. By recording your experiences and successes in Xello you will have a permanent record of the things you have done. When you come to write your CV or personal statement, Xello will automatically add all of these in for you, without you having to try and remember what you did and when.

Using Portfolios - Portfolios let you showcase everything you do, in or out of school. This video explains how to create Portfolios; the link to the video can also be found on the home page of Xello in Links and Resources.

#### Remember, you access Xello via Office/Microsoft 365:

- Click on the 9 dots (top left of the screen) and then on the Xello icon
- Once in Xello, click on About Me in the black menu bar at the top of the page
- Scroll down the page and either add an experience or upload something into Portfolios (the new name for Storyboard)
