

Year 10 - Vocational grades for reports

Further to the Year 10 interim reports which are now available for parents/carers to view via MCAS, please find below an explanation of grading for vocational subjects.

How do Cambridge Nationals grades compare to GCSE (9-1)?



Grades for Cambridge Nationals and for GCSEs align at key points.

Level 1 covers GCSE grades 3–1 (or D–G) and Level 2 GCSE grades 9–4 (or A*–C).

- The bottom of a Level 1 Pass is aligned to GCSE grade 1
- The bottom of a Level 2 Pass is aligned to GCSE grade 4
- The bottom of a Level 2 Distinction is aligned to grade 7

10. School Ski trip 2025 update

We are looking to increase our numbers for this trip to 50 students, if anyone would like to join this please see the information below.

Following on from the continued success of the school ski trips, we are now taking deposits for the trip planned for February half-term 2025. Non-skiers are more than welcome, with over 50% usually attending annually.

The total cost of the trip is £1589.00, which is broken down into instalments over the year. The price is great value for what for the students will be offered and they have an amazing experience. We have received many offers and quotes, and this is best price, with the best hotel and slopes on offer that we have used for many years.

The group of approx. 40-50 students travel to Austria for six days of skiing for 5 hours a day. The price includes travel, full board accommodation (3 meals a day), ski pass, ski equipment hire (skis, poles, ski helmet and boot hire), full ski tuition, a trip hoodie and evening activities. The accommodation has full ensuite facilities and great in-house entertainment.
