We are looking to increase our numbers for this trip to 50 students, if anyone would like to join this, please see the information below.





Following on from the continued success of the school ski trips, we are now taking deposits for the trip planned for February half-term 2025. Non-skiers are more than welcome, with over 50% usually attending annually.

The total cost of the trip is £1589.00, which is broken down into instalments over the year. The price is

great value for what for the students will be offered and they have an amazing experience. We have received many offers and quotes, and this is best price, with the best hotel and slopes on offer that we have used for many years.

The group of approx. 40-50 students travel to Austria for six days of skiing for 5 hours a day. The price includes travel, full board accommodation (3 meals a day), ski pass, ski equipment hire (skis, poles, ski helmet and boot hire), full ski tuition, a trip hoodie and evening activities. The accommodation has full en-suite facilities and great in-house entertainment.

13. PE Fixtures - Year 7 Girls Football

On Tuesday 16th January the Year 7 girls team took part in a football tournament at The Regis School. FCC 1 Team's first game was up against St Phillip Howard (SPH), with the opposing team having some strong, determined players, so we needed to give them a tough game. One of SPH's skillful wingers dribbled the ball down the wing where her shot was then taken down by Chloe, who passed it up the pitch to Sydney who took a first time shot which unfortunately rebounded off the post. The first game finished 0-0 despite the girls' determination.

FCC 1 Team were then up against Bourne Community College in which we dominated the game with plenty of opportunities to score. The game finished with Armelle scoring in the last two minutes with some lovely passing through the defence with Sydney, striking the ball in the top corner.

The next group game was up against Chichester Free School in which they got an early goal, so the girls had to work hard to equalize. The equalizing goal came from Sydney after pressing high onto Chichester's defender, with the shot going straight through the keepers' arms into the net.

Felpham's last game was up against Chichester Free School, where the girls fought hard, with Chichester's team having some great attacking players. The game finished 0-1 to Chichester.

FCC 2 Team's first game was up against The Regis School, the game started off close with The Regis crossing the ball across the net allowing goalkeeper Sophie to make a save. Sophie rolled the ball out to Mya, who quickly passed the ball to Molly who made a powerful strike in the top corner of the goal making it 1-0. Despite all the efforts from The Regis School to defend, Molly's skills meant she was through on goal for the second time, smashing the ball into the bottom corner. A substitute was then made, replacing Molly with Sara. Caitlyn was quick to close the ball down after The Regis center pass - Caitlyn passed it through the defence to Sara, who weaved the ball round their last defender and took a shot landing in the back of the net. The game finished 5-0.

Their second game was against Six Villages, which we knew was going to be a tough game. Having a player down impacted us in this game, with Six Villages having some fast players down the wing. Unfortunately, the game finished 0-2 to Six Villages, however the girls continued to battle until the final whistle.
