Dear Parents and Carers

Year 7 Girls' Football - 7-a-side tournament

On Monday 26th February, the Year 7 girls' football team travelled over to Warblington school to take part in the 7-a-side tournament for the Hampshire league. With the games only being 15 minutes long, the girls knew they had to work hard whilst playing.

First up the girls were up against Warblington School A Team. The girls dominated this game. Felpham took the lead in the first 2 minutes with Syd using her skills to dribble down the wing, crossing the ball across the pitch to Armelle who strikes the ball first time across the goalkeeper, making it 1-0. The second goal game from Mazie who dribbled through Warblington's defence and became 1v1 with the keeper. Mazie released the ball at the perfect time, top corner, slipping past the keeper's hands making the game 2-0. Another goal came from Chloe who took a powerful shot outside the box, into the bottom corner. Felpham showed a very strong performance during this game with a final score of 6-0.

Up next, the girls faced Purbrook School. By their previous result, the girls knew this would be a tough game. Felpham started off really strong as a team however we knew Purbrook had some good players, who took every chance they had. Purbrook won the ball in the middle of the pitch. They took advantage of this and sprinted forward taking an early shot, where Sophie made an amazing save, tipping the ball over the crossbar out for a corner. Purbrook took this corner early where their strike tapped the ball into the bottom corner. The girls continued to battle in this game working as a team to help both defend and attack. The game finished 2-0 to Purbrook.

The girls were then faced with The Hayling College. The game was tight for the first few minutes with both teams having equal amount of possession. Felpham were pressing high when Armelle passed the ball back to Grace, who crossed the ball into the box. Syd attacked the ball first time, scoring a lovely goal. This game ended 4-0 to Felpham. During this game the girls played some amazing football, they had great possession and showed their amazing skills.

Finally, the girls were up against Warblington School B Team. Again, Felpham knew this game would be tough, but they never gave up. Warblington took the lead with an early goal, passing the ball quickly through our defence and into the bottom corner of the goal. Warblington were 2-0 up when an outstanding goal kick came from Sophie, who kicked the ball to the other end of the pitch where Maize used her strength to shield the goalkeeper away, tapping the ball into the goal. The girls had very little time left to get an equalising goal meaning they took every chance possible. The team's determination meant they finally found the equalising goal in the last minute of the game with a shot from Mollie, in the top corner of the goal, making the game finish 2-2.

I am very proud of the girls; you all played so well and showed some amazing football skills. You all have bright futures ahead of you! Keep up all the hard work.
