# Sixth Form Taster Day - Tuesday 12th March

Sixth Form Taster Day takes place on Tuesday. We have 117 students taking part in taster day - these are all the students who said 'yes' or 'maybe' to Sixth Form as part of their Futures Meetings discussions. Students will be with a Sixth Form tutor during registration. They have all opted for 4 different taster sessions and they will spend 1 lesson in the hub being introduced to the EPQ. During lesson 6 all students taking part in taster day will be involved in a quiz in the main hall. Students have received their individual timetables this week. Students can come to school in non-uniform and will have exclusive access to the Sixth Form facilities throughout the day.

Those students who are not considering coming to Sixth Form next year will follow their usual timetable (with the possible exception of period 5 and 6). This is an excellent opportunity for these students to have additional support from their teachers in small groups. Students will register with their normal tutors in the morning. Students have received their individual timetables this week. These students must come in school uniform and bring their PE kit for periods 5 and 6. Students will be sent home to change if they come into school in non-uniform.

#### 5. Ramadan

Ramadan mubarak to all of our students and their families who will begin fasting for the holy month of Ramadan on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March.

Our Year 8 students have been learning about Ramadan in their RPE lessons:

- Ramadan is a holy month in Islam.
- During Ramadan Muslims have to fast (do not eat or drink) during daylight hours. They will eat and drink before sunrise and after sunset.
- It is the fourth Pillar of Islam (sawm).
- The main reason for fasting is to show or prove loyalty to Allah.
- Fasting helps Muslims to understand what it would be like to be very poor and not have enough to eat.
- It also helps remind Muslims not to be greedy or selfish.
- The festival of Id-UI-Fitr follows Ramadan.
- Every day at sunset. Muslims have a meal called **iftar** to break their fast.

Following on from the continued success of the school ski trips, we are now taking deposits for the trip planned for February half-term 2025. Non-skiers are more than welcome, with over 50% usually attending annually. The total cost of this trip will be £1589.00, which is broken down into instalments over the year. The price is great value for what for the students are being offered and they will have an amazing experience.

The group of approx. 40-50 students travel to Austria for 6 days of skiing for 5 hours a day. The price will include travel, full board accommodation (3 meals a day), ski pass, ski equipment hire (skis, poles, ski helmet and boot hire), full ski tuition, a trip hoodie and evening activities. The accommodation has full ensuite facilities and great in-house entertainment.
