Message from Ms Pike, Headteacher:

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you so much for your support over the last term, as we send everyone home to have what we hope will be an excellent and restful break. The Spring term is always an extremely busy one, and this one has certainly been no exception. This is especially true of our students who will take exams in a few short weeks. If your child is one of them, our hope for them is a good mix of rest and revision to set them up brilliantly for the challenges ahead. If they are invited to one of our holiday support sessions across a range of subjects, we look forward to seeing them. We are lucky to have a range of staff willing to spend extra time supporting students, and I offer my sincere thanks to them, along with the colleagues who are in school over the holidays looking after our site and our systems.

As I mentioned last week, we are all about evaluating and improving. The end of a term and the beginning of a new one is always an excellent time to reflect and set up improvements. One of the areas we have been working on is encouraging the best behaviour within school, and particularly within lessons, so that we can offer the very best learning experience. This is something that all schools nationally are having to do (you may have seen the news reports around this issue this very morning), but we want to be at the forefront of change for the right reasons.

We have looked carefully at our data on behaviour, and whilst positive points outweigh negative ones by more than 4 to 1, the main causes of issues and sanctions are lateness to lesson and not responding to warnings about classroom behaviour.

So, we are making some changes to improve promptness to lessons, tackle disruption to learning and reduce detentions - students have been made aware of this during the last week. Lateness and inappropriate behaviour in lessons will no longer result in a 'safehouse' and detention - students being removed to our new Reset room, where they will stay and work quietly for the remainder of the double lesson and for the following social time. If the lateness or poor behaviour is in Periods 5/6, we need to let you know that this will mean that students will be staying in the Reset room for 15 minutes after the end of school, so will leave at 15:05.

As I mentioned before, we really value your support with this and all the other initiatives in school that help our students and our community.
